Dr. Caswell Evans, coordinator for the 2002 Surgeon General's Report on the Silent Epidemic and the 2003 "Call to Action," was an active member of the original Coalition for NH's Oral Health work team that developed and published the New Hampshire Oral Health Plan: A Framework for Action. He will provide the morning's keynote address and facilitate a conversational retrospective that includes many of the state's oral health leaders from 2000 through 2016.

Dr. Jane Grover, has supported NH's Federally-Qualified Health Centers and dental community by providing expertise and consultation to help build strong community-based oral health programs. She will be the afternoon's keynote speaker and will moderate a future-looking prospective of innovative programs and strategies that are moving New Hampshire into the future.
